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This course gives an overview of the difference between young learners and learners at other ages in terms of learning of language structures and skills. This course identifies learner styles and strategies of young learners and develops activities (e.g.: puzzles, stories and games, simulations) and audio visual aids (e.g.: pictures, realia, cartoons, puppets, songs) for the teaching of vocabulary, language skills (listening and speaking) and structures. This course also outlines classroom management techniques and emphasizes the importance of collaborative learning and interaction through group and pair work. Student teachers will also design a material or a course for a chosen syllabus type teaching activities and assessment practices for a diverse range of young learners.
